

**MOTHER TERESA'S CANONIZATION
MOTHER INDIA SALUTES**

Apostle of the Poor-Saint of the Gutters




God makes the Saints and Pope declares a saint! Among all reasons, Mother Teresa would be receiving the “Halo” for her Holiness! Catholic belief holds that if someone is truly a saint, that individual is already in heaven. A canonization is understood as an after-the-fact recognition of what’s already happened. In other words, canonization is not for the saint, it’s for the rest of us - lifting up a new role model of holiness, and a new friend in heaven to whom the whole Church can pray. It’s also worth recalling that sainthood is a very democratic process in Catholic life. It’s supposed to start

with popular devotion to a given figure who had a reputation for sanctity. Officialdom is to come in only after that’s been established, investigating the candidate and, eventually applying its seal of approval. In all honesty, Mother Teresa was a saint in the hearts of most people of India long before her name will be entered into the official canon.

Mother Teresa Model of Mercy

Most fascinating of Blessed Mother Teresa being canonized during the Year of Mercy Jubilee is the fact of her translation Mercy into Concrete and corporal works of Mercy.

Mercy is at its core a spiritual virtue, and it must be given tangible expression in concrete actions of service. In Christian tradition, one time-honoured set of examples comes in the corporal works of mercy, which include feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick, and so on. Few Catholic figures ever, and probably none in her own time, better illustrated



that drive to make mercy concrete than Mother Teresa, from her AIDS hospices and soup kitchens to her homes for lost children and refugees. There was virtually no source of human suffering for which she didn't offer a practical, hands-on response. If we are tempted to grumble about a lack of time or resources, Mother Teresa also offers another valuable example. You don't really need deep pockets or massive infrastructure to get something done, only the relentless will to make it happen.

Already Acclaimed Saint

Pope Francis will declare Blessed Teresa of Kolkata a saint at the Vatican Sept. 4. The date was announced March 15 during an "ordinary public consistory," a meeting of the pope, cardinals and promoters of sainthood causes that formally end the sainthood process. Mother Teresa was widely known as a living saint as she ministered to the sick and the dying in some of the poorest neighbourhoods in the world. Although some people criticized her for not also challenging the injustices that kept so many people so poor and abandoned, her simple service touched the hearts of millions of people of all faiths. The miracle that cleared the way for Mother Teresa's canonization involved the healing of a Brazilian man from brain abscesses.

Bio-Data with Dark Night of Her Soul

Born to an ethnic Albanian family in Skopje, in what is now part of Macedonia, she came to India in 1929 as a Sister of Loreto and became an Indian citizen in 1947. She founded the Missionaries of Charity in 1950. Shortly after she died in 1997, St. John Paul II waived the usual five-year waiting period and allowed the opening of the process to declare her sainthood. She was beatified in 2003. After her beatification, Missionary of Charity Father Brian Kolodiejchuk, the postulator of her sainthood cause, published a book of her letters, "Mother Teresa: Come Be My Light." The letters illustrated how, for decades, she experienced what is described as a "dark night of the soul" in Christian spirituality; she felt that God had abandoned her. While the letters shocked some people, others saw them as proof of her steadfast faith in God, which was not based on feelings or signs that he was with her. The date chosen for her canonization is the eve of the 19th anniversary of her death.


Preparations for celebration at Kolkata

Scholars, priests, students and artists are continuously holding seminars, exhibitions and prayer meetings every day across the city to promote "Mother Teresa's philosophy towards humanity" If anyone was a role model of a successful Catholic leader, it was Mother Teresa. As the Church's newest saint, she'll doubtless continue to lead in a whole new way. Being a poor woman, without any great Office, she proves to the world that to be kind and to do merciful, we need not be higher-ups and any ordinary could be and become extraordinary in Holiness!

I. POPE'S VANI

CONFESSION IS ENCOUNTER WITH GOD'S'RE-CREATING MERCY'

Pope Francis commended the sacrament of confession as the prime means of encountering God's mercy in his message sent Monday to Italy's National Liturgical Week, which is being held in Gubbio. In Confession “there is fulfilled the encounter with the re-creating mercy of God whence come new women and men who announce the good life of the Gospel by a life which is reconciled and reconciling,” the Pope said in a message signed by the Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Pietro Parolin and sent Aug. 22 to Bishop Claudio Maniago of Castellana, president of Italy's Center for Liturgy.



The National Liturgical Week is focusing this year on “liturgy as a place of mercy.” Pope Francis noted that this theme “helps one perceive that the entire liturgy is a place where mercy is encountered and welcomed in order to be given; a place where the great mystery of reconciliation is made present, announced, celebrated, and communicated.” While each sacrament and sacramental show forth God's mercy “according to the diverse circumstances of life ... The gift of Mercy is resplendent in a particular way in the sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation,” he said.

“We are reconciled so as to reconcile. The mercy of the Father cannot be confined in 'intimistic' and 'self-consoling' attitudes, because its potency is demonstrated in the renewal of persons, rendering them capable of offering to others a living experience of the same gift.” The Pope exhorted that “based on the belief that one is pardoned in order to pardon, we must be witnesses of mercy in every environment, provoking a desire and a capacity for pardon.” “This is a task to which we are all called,” he said, “especially in front of the rancor in which too many are entrapped, who needs to rediscover the joy of interior serenity and the taste of peace.”

Pope Francis reflected that Confession “must therefore be perceived as an expression of the 'Church in outreach', as a 'door' not only by which to re-enter after having been away, but also a 'threshold' open to the various peripheries of humanity ever more in need of compassion.” The message concluded with the Pope's hope that the celebration of Italy's Liturgical Week would promote an “ecclesial and personal life full of mercy and compassion.”

II. MOTHER TERESA 1910 – 1997



Small...blue eyed, a character of wrinkles, dynamic, strong and determined, mother Teresa was the very incarnation of mercy and compassion. She was a moving image of good and godliness, ever full of hope, cheer, sunshine, gentle smile, prayers and benediction. This apostle of love, hope and mercy had been the mother in the truest sense of the term to millions and millions of destitute, deprived, ill and dying in India and abroad. A single frail and bent down woman, her body draped in a coarse white sari with a broad blue border reaching out to millions of homeless, poor, needy, destitute and diseased instantly reminded of Buddha and Christ.

Mother Teresa Her mission and ministry of mercy and compassion were limitless and ever expanding. Consequently, she became the most loved and respected woman of the world. She became internationally known for her charitable work for the victims of disease, illness, poverty, exploitation, neglect and adversity. Mother Teresa was named Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu at her birth by her parents. She was born on 26th August, 1910 in Skopje, Macedonia. Her Albanian parents were Catholics. Her father Kole was a small businessman and her mother Drana a housewife. Agnes was the youngest of her parent's three children.

When she was only 9 years old her father suddenly died and her mother had to look after the family single handedly. She had to do add jobs to support her three children and herself. She was God-fearing and a religious lady and always found time for prayers, counting the rosary and visiting the church. This had a lasting impact on Agnes and decided the future course of her life. Teresa went to Ireland in 1928 and joined the Blessed Virgin Mary Institute. And then, hardly six weeks later, she left for India to become a teacher. She studied nursing and went to the slums of Kolkata, the home of the most neglected and deprived men, women and children of the world. One day, soon after her coming as a young Yugoslav Loreto nun from Loreto Abbey, Rathfarnham in Dublin, she was travelling to Darjeeling in a train. Then suddenly she had a vision and heard God's call to leave the Loreto Order and work among the poorest of India's poor. God had told her his wish and directed what she should do. He wanted that she should serve him and seek him among the destitute. Therefore, she founded the Order of the Missionaries of Charity, an institution of women dedicated to the service of the lepers, diseased and destitute in 1950.

The passing away of this saint of the gutters at the age of 87 years plunged millions of people into untold sorrow and mourning and orphaned thousands of people. Physically she is no more with us, but her spirit of love, service, charity and compassion is always there to guide and help us all. In the recognition of her selfless services the Pope granted her Sainthood. Really, she became a role model of charity, compassion, holiness and selfless service.

III. BIRTH OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Church celebrates today the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne. The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church. These accounts, although not considered authoritative in the same manner as the Bible, outline some of the Church's traditional beliefs about the birth of Mary. The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."



Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves extensively and rigorously to prayer and fasting, initially wondering whether their inability to conceive a child might signify God's displeasure with them. As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah, as an angel revealed to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honor their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth, and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

After Mary's birth, according to the Protoevangelium of James, Anne "made a sanctuary" in the infant girl's room, and "allowed nothing common or unclean" on account of the special holiness of the child. The same writing records that when she was one year old, her father "made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel." "And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations' . . . And he brought her to the chief priests, and they blessed her, saying: 'O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be for ever.'"

The protoevangelium goes on to describe how Mary's parents, along with the temple priests, subsequently decided that she would be offered to God as a consecrated Virgin for the rest of her life, and enter a chaste marriage with the carpenter Joseph. Saint Augustine described the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary as an event of cosmic and historic significance, and an appropriate prelude to the birth of Jesus Christ. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley," he said. The fourth-century bishop, whose theology profoundly shaped the Western Church's understanding of sin and human nature, affirmed that "through her birth, the nature inherited from our first parents is changed."

IV. TEACHERS' DAY

Teachers' day is celebrated every year on the birth anniversary of a great person Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan. He was highly dedicated towards the teaching profession. It is said that, once he was approached by some students and requested for celebrating his birthday on 5th of September. And he replied that instead of celebrating it my birthday only, you should celebrated it as a teachers day to pay honour to all teachers for their great works and contributions. Teachers are the real shapers of the future building blocks of the country means they shape up the students life who are ultimately the future of country.



Teachers' are the nation-builders by building the future of citizens living in the country. But nobody was there in the society to think about teachers and their contributions. The whole credit goes to only one leader of India, President Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan who advised us to celebrate his birthday as teacher's day. Since 1962, 5th of September is being observed as Teacher's Day every year. Our teachers not only teach us about subjects, but they also improve our personality, confidence and skill level. They make us able to get over from any problem or difficulty all through the life.

V. TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS

This day is also called the Exaltation of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross, Holy Cross Day, Holy Rood Day, or Roodmas. The liturgy of the Cross is a triumphant liturgy. When Moses lifted up the bronze serpent over the people, it was a foreshadowing of the salvation through Jesus when He was lifted up on the Cross. Our Mother Church sings of the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of our redemption. To follow Christ we must take up His cross, follow Him and become obedient until death, even if it means death on the cross. We identify with Christ on the Cross and become co-redeemers, sharing in His cross.

We made the Sign of the Cross before prayer which helps to fix our minds and hearts to God. After prayer we make the Sign of the Cross to keep close to God. During trials and temptations our strength and protection is the Sign of the Cross. At Baptism we are sealed with the Sign of the Cross, signifying the fullness of redemption and that we belong to Christ. Let us look to the cross frequently, and realize that when we make the Sign of the Cross we give our entire self to God - mind, soul, heart, body, will, thoughts. O cross, you are the glorious sign of victory. Through your power may we share in the triumph of Christ Jesus.

Symbol : The cross of triumph is usually pictured as a globe with the cross on top, symbolic of the triumph of our Savior over the sin of the world, and world conquest of His Gospel through the means of a grace (cross and orb).

VI. OUR LADY OF SORROWS

The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord. Traditionally, this suffering was not limited to the passion and death event; rather, it comprised the seven dolors or seven sorrows of Mary, which were foretold by the Priest Simeon who proclaimed to Mary, This child [Jesus] is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed and you yourself shall be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare (Luke 2:34-35). These seven sorrows of our Blessed Mother included the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt; the loss and finding of the child Jesus in the Temple; Mary's meeting of Jesus on His way to Calvary; Mary's standing at the foot of the cross when our Lord was crucified; her holding of Jesus when He was taken down from the cross; and then our Lord's burial. In all, the prophesy of Simeon that a sword would pierce our Blessed Mother's heart was fulfilled in these events. For this reason, Mary is sometimes depicted with her heart exposed and with seven swords piercing it. More importantly, each new suffering was received with the courage, love, and trust that echoed her fiat, let it be done unto me according to Thy word, first uttered at the Annunciation. This Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows grew in popularity in the 12th century, although under various titles.

IX. INFORMATION

1. Hearty Welcome to Sisters of the Immaculate for Banjara Mission

Missionary sisters of the Immaculate (Province of Hyderabad)

The Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate (Nirmala Sisters or PIME Sisters) came into existence in the Church on 8th December 1936 in Milan – Italy. Mother Giuseppina Dones and Mother Igilda Rodolfi: the Foundresses, Blessed Paolo Manna PIME, the Inspirer of the Charism and Msgr. Lorenzo Maria Balconi PIME, the Co-Founder (Then superior General of PIME).

This Institute is exclusively missionary Congregation, International and Intercultural, with a noble Charism: The Living Passion to Proclaim the Good News of Jesus to all Peoples, especially those who do not know it yet. To live it dynamically, we give creative expressions through various apostolic activities, making it a powerful channel for Evangelization. We live our Charism in and through the Pastoral and Catechetical Ministry, Health Care, Educational and Boarding Ministry and Developmental work.

This missionary family is spread in India, Bangladesh, Brazil, Hong Kong, England, Cameroon, Guinea Bissau, Algeria and Papua New Guinea. In India we have three provinces and one Delegation: such as Vijayawada, Hyderabad, Siliguri (West Bengal) and Delhi Delegation.

To live concretely our charism and to give dynamic expressions to the invitation of the Holy Father Francis to go the peripheries; on 17th August 2016, began our Satellite Presence at Mahabubabad in the Diocese of Warangal, to evangelize the people of Banjara Mission.

1. Nuncio to India transferred to Poland

Archbishop Salvatore Pennacchio, the Apostolic Nuncio to India and Nepal, has been transferred to Poland. This was announced in Rome on August 6, the feast of Transfiguration of Jesus, said a letter from Bishop Theodore Mascarenhas, secretary general of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. Archbishop Pennacchio, who turns 64 on September 7, will leave for Poland in October, after completing his term in India, the letter adds.

There has been no announcement yet about his successor in India. Archbishop Pennacchio became the Vatican ambassador to India in 2010. Earlier, the ever smiling and amiable prelate was the nuncio of Thailand, Singapore and Cambodia and apostolic delegated to Myanmar, Laos, Malaysia and Brunei, based at Bangkok from 2003.

During that period, he oversaw the successful conduct of the first Asian Mission Congress at Chiang Mai, Thailand. About 1,000 people, mostly from Asia, attended the Oct. 18-22, 2006 gathering that reflected on the theme, "The Story of Jesus in Asia: A Celebration of Faith and Life." His first appointment as a nuncio was to Rwanda in 1998. He was ordained an

archbishop on January 6, 1999. He was born in Marano, Naples, in Italy, and had just turned 24 when he was ordained a priest on September 18, 1976, for Aversa diocese, southern Italy. He joined the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy and entered the diplomatic service of the Holy See on April 15, 1979.

He has served in the Apostolic Nunciatures in Panama, Ethiopia, Australia, Turkey, Egypt, Yugoslavia and Ireland. He holds a doctorate in Philosophy and entered into the Diplomatic Service of the Holy See. He speaks English, French and Spanish.

2. Vatican Prepares for Mother Teresa's Canonization

Masses, prayer vigils, exhibitions and even a musical will be some of the many events taking place in Rome to celebrate the canonization of Blessed Mother Teresa on Sept. 4.

Not only will Pope Francis be raising Mother Teresa to the altars at a canonization Mass in St. Peter's Square on Sept. 4, the entire week — Sept. 1-8 — will be devoted to celebrating the Albanian religious sister who became known as the “angel of the slums.” The events begin on Sept. 1, with the opening of an “Exposition of the Life, Spirit and Message of Mother Teresa” at the LUMSA university in Rome. The exposition will last until Sept. 7.

On the evening of Sept. 1, the Missionaries of Charity will provide a “family feast” for the poor under their care at the Santa Cecilia auditorium on the Via della Conciliazione. Part of the evening's highlights: Mother Teresa: The Musical by the Italian musician, author, singer and actor Michele Paolicelli. Three consecutive Masses to honor Mother Teresa are scheduled for the following day in three languages — English, Spanish and Italian — at the Basilica of St. Anastasia, close to the Missionaries of Charity motherhouse and Rome's Circus Maximus, with veneration of the relics of Blessed Teresa of Kolkata after each Mass.

Mercy is a major theme of the canonization, and the sacrament of reconciliation will be available during the Masses. In the afternoon, pilgrims are free to pass through the holy doors of the basilica or see an exhibition celebrating Mother Teresa's life. A prayer vigil with solemn adoration will take place in the evening at St. John Lateran Basilica, led by Cardinal Agostino Vallini, the vicar of Rome. The theme is “Radiating the Light of Christ: A Call to Holiness,” praying for “holy families, holy consecrated men and women and, especially, for holy priests, ministers of mercy.” The faithful will also be given the opportunity to go to confession during adoration.


